## WHAT IS EKTERLY® (sebetralstat)?

EKTERLY is a prescription medicine used to treat sudden (acute) attacks of hereditary angioedema (HAE) in adults and children aged 12 years of age and older. It is not known if EKTERLY is safe and effective in children under 12 years of age.

# Starting off on the right foot

As you become more independent, things change—whether it's a new school, work, or even moving away from home. As you settle into new routines and begin to take more ownership of your treatment, it's important to understand what you might need to manage your HAE attacks. And having the right tools and resources will help you feel more confident in taking control of your own health.

# Here are a few **helpful tips**:



## **Know your HAE triggers**

Track what tends to set off attacks for you—stress, sports, illness, etc.



## Be prepared

- Always have at least 2 doses of EKTERLY on hand to treat attacks
- Be aware of the locations of the closest emergency services, whether you're at home, school, or traveling



## Don't delay treating an attack

- You know your body best, so if you're experiencing an attack, take one dose (2 pills) as soon as you can
- You may take a second dose after 3 hours, with no more than 4 pills in 24 hours



## Speak up

Be sure those in your care circle (school nurses, teachers, coaches, friends, partners, etc.) understand your HAE, what an attack may look like, and what to do, or where to find your EKTERLY if necessary.



## Store EKTERLY for easy access

Ensure that EKTERLY is stored at room temperature and easily accessible—in a purse, backpack, pocket, or small med pouch.

# Getting to know **EKTERLY**

EKTERLY is the first and only oral treatment for HAE attacks—approved for ages 12 and up.

EKTERLY is a needle-free way to stop your attacks from getting worse—with no preparation needed. You can carry it with you and take it to stop your attacks fast—anytime, anywhere you are.

- In a clinical study, most teens (ages 12-17) who took EKTERLY started to feel better in a median time of **1.8 hours**
- Teens in the same trial were able to treat their attack within a median time of 9 minutes after they felt attack symptoms
- 94% of attacks that were effectively treated with EKTERLY required just 1 dose
- You can take EKTERLY for any type of HAE attack, no matter where it shows up






## If you're experiencing a throat (laryngeal) attack:

Seek medical care immediately (call 911) and take EKTERLY as directed. These types of attacks can be life-threatening and need immediate medical attention.



This co-pay assistance program is intended only for eligible patients with commercial (private) insurance. # Do not miss out on coverage

Health insurance might not be the most exciting thing to think about—but it's essential in maintaining your EKTERLY prescription.

When to make sure you're covered and know the benefits that coverage supports:

- Starting a new job—Talk to your employer about insurance coverage, including when it starts and what is covered
- Turning 26 years old—When you turn 26, you most likely will lose coverage under your parents' insurance. It's important to find insurance for yourself, either through an employer-sponsored program or through government platforms such as the Health Insurance Marketplace
- Parents enrolling in Medicare—If your parents sign up for Medicare, you typically will not be eligible to stay on their plan. You'll need to find new coverage either through work or a government-sponsored plan



If you need to sign up for your own commercial insurance, keep in mind that open enrollment typically runs from **November 1 to January 15** each year.
